(CHARLOTTE, NC) – Saebo, Inc., a leading provider of innovative stroke rehabilitation technology products, finished its first full year in business in Charlotte, reaching a number of important milestones. After securing its “Series A” funding from CHMG Capital and moving to Charlotte in late 2004, the company accomplished the following in calendar year 2005:

- The number of employees grew from 5 to 14, including two international sales and marketing representatives.
- Net Revenue for the year grew by more than 300%.
- By the end of 2005, the company had trained more than 1,000 Physical and Occupational Therapists in 42 states and six foreign countries
- In December of 2005, Saebo shipped its 2,000th *SaeboFlex* to a stroke survivor customer. (The company’s flagship product, the *SaeboFlex* is a dynamic orthosis that enables patients who have suffered decreased use of their upper extremity as a result of a stroke to actually re-gain functionality of the affected hand and/or arm.)
- To accommodate this growth, in the fourth quarter, Saebo moved to an 8,000 sf office facility adjacent to its existing location.
- Finally, through its extensive investment in research and development, the company positioned itself for exciting new product launches in 2006.

“We are extremely proud of our accomplishments in 2005,” said Henry Hoffman, President and Co-Founder of Saebo. “We have a great staff, and a great network of therapists across the country who understand the incredible gains that patients can make during a course of therapy with the *SaeboFlex*.”
